Dear Parents and Guardians,

The audition for the Missoula Children's Theatre production of <u>The Jungle Book</u> will be held on February 29 at 3:30 pm at the High School Stage. There are roles for students Kindergarten through 12th. Approximately 50-60 local students will be cast to appear in the show with the MCT Tour Actor/Director. There is no guarantee that everyone who auditions will be cast in the play. Students wishing to audition must arrive by the scheduled starting time and stay for the entire two-hour session. The first rehearsal begins approximately 15-30 minutes after the audition.

This is a group audition - **no advance preparation is necessary**, but a smile \odot never hurts. Students should just be ready to come and have a good time!

Rehearsals will be conducted Monday through Friday from 3:30 pm to 8:00 pm at the stage in the Tonasket High School. Although not all cast members will be needed at every session, those auditioning must have a clear schedule for the entire week and **if selected, be able to attend all rehearsals required for their role**. A detailed rehearsal schedule will be distributed at the conclusion of the audition. Cast members scheduled for the full 4½ hours of rehearsal will be asked to bring a sack lunch, dinner or snack.

The performances will be held on March 3 at 3 pm ad 5:30 pm and will be presented at the Tonasket High School Stage. The students in the cast will be called for dress rehearsal before the performance that day. All those cast must be available for **all** scheduled performances.

This coming year more than 65,000 cast members across the globe will take to the stage to the delight and applause of their families, friends, community, neighbors and teachers!
